




A Note from Adam

One Great Hour of Sharing



2024 is the 75th anniversary year of One Great Hour of Sharing, which is collected by many denominations and Church World Service. This Lenten Offering supports the disaster, refugee, and development ministries of the United Church of Christ within Wider Church Ministries.

Through this offering we support life-giving recovery efforts when disasters devastate communities and lives. We empower partners worldwide in their labors to build sustainable futures. We plant seeds of peace where war has multiplied despair and destruction.

Central Board News and Notes:



The Central Board met February 21. We welcomed Rev. Adam to his first meeting and heard from him about his first month. He has been filling out forms as a new hire, meeting staff and members of congregation, attending meetings and meeting clergy in the community. He expressed interest in being more active on the church's Facebook page and will be introducing an online devotional. He is emailing each church member and will be calling those without email access.

Building Our Legacy Team Update – The Team has been working with their attorneys on a real estate Zoning Opinion and on a letter to the Attorney General's Office (AGO) laying out the church's intended plans for the building. Lifebridge's Letter of Interest will accompany the letter, and both are expected to be submitted this week. This is a preliminary inquiry to determine if the AGO will consider the church's proposal that our legacy would be to follow our long term mission rather than transfer the church to another house of worship.

Forward Chats – After reviewing several options there will be a Forward Chat on Sunday, March 17, after church. The topic will be a presentation by Rev. Adam called the "Death Café". More information will be available on this topic as the date approaches.

SNEUCC Super Saturday on March 9th - The Southern New England Conference is hosting an event where there will be all day worship and workshops. This is being held in Southbridge, MA and preregistration is required by February 26. Property Team / Building Use – several projects were reported on including: 1) the Lower Parish Hall water bubbler was removed; 2) several vendors are coming in to look at the lift and give quotes. A determination will be made whether it can be repaired or will need to be replaced; 3) the North Shore Christian School have located a place to move to and hope to be out by the end of summer. We are in discussions on what they will need (dumpster, storage pods, places to put boxes, etc.)

Technology Team – It was reported that representatives interviewed a candidate for the part time position to coordinate the Sunday service/Zoom broadcast. They have made an offer and are waiting to hear if he is interested. The position would be paid at \$25/hour so working Sundays would be \$50.

Finance Team – The Finance Team reported on its February meeting. Since we are one month into the new year there was nothing significant to report. Both revenues and expenses are tracking close to the annual budget. The Team is exploring making the investments safer from market fluctuations. The past focus had been on long-term investments which could weather the market's ups and downs. Now that the focus is just a few years, it makes sense to look at safer financial instruments.

The next Central Board meeting is scheduled for **Wednesday, March 20**th at 7:00 pm. Contact the church office or one of the Central Board members if you would like to participate.
